W ow! In a few weeks, my board year will be over and so this will be the last chair's note I write. For the previous two issues, I wrote what I felt was around me at the time. But this time I was lacking some ideas, and I did what every scientist does when they need an extra hint: I asked ChatGPT! Some of the topics proposed by ChatGPT were "The Diversity Dilemma: Embracing Inclusion on Campus," "The Power of Volunteering: Impacting Communities as a Student Leader," and "Fashion Forward: Trends and Styles Redefining Student Culture." But then it got me thinking, where do these ideas come from? The topics seem random, but also popular and familiar. Is AI giving me real ideas or is it, as Nicki Minaj would say, a remix of existing ideas? Does AI commit plagiarism? Is AI innocent? I took a deep dive to find out how much AI actually plagiarizes.

Before taking on this discussion, let us first define the three different forms of plagiarism that exist:

 The most basic form is outright plagiarism; the act of presenting someone else's work as your own. This would be me taking an assignment from a friend who took a course a few years ago and submitting it as my homework.

2. Paraphrasing plagiarism is already on the topic of this assignment. It occurs when a writer takes someone else's work and changes a few words or sentences. Many students are unaware that this is plagiarism. Even if you express someone else's original idea in your own words, without giving them credit it is still considered plagiarism.

3. Unintentional plagiarism is often the most common form of plagiarism because it occurs when the writer is unaware that he or she is using someone else's work.


Fun fact: You can plagiarize yourself! So the next time you have a good idea in an assignment and decide to write an elaborate paper on it, don't forget to cite your own work! (And it would be hypocritical of me to not cite my source for this: <u>https://grammarly.com/blog/</u> <u>types-of-plagiarism/</u>) Plagiarism should be avoided. You are taking the work of others and passing it on as your own work; you are being dishonest. AI is a powerful tool that can write essays, poems, mystery novels, and even simple code. Some would say that AI writing tools could potentially replace human writers in the future, but the reality is that AI writing comes with its own set of challenges and dangers. AI studies previously published content, whether found on the web or created by other users, and applies paraphrasing and machine learning to generate "unique" content. However, as noted above, paraphrasing someone else's context and then calling it unique and your own is, in fact, fraud.

" ... I did what every scientist does when they need an extra hint: I asked ChatGPT! ,, However, Artificial Intelligence tools try to create original, which makes their usage different from outright plagiarism. The use of an AI tool is not considered plagiarism if it generates content from scratch through machine learning. However, not every AI tool can generate unique content. ChatGPT and other language models can create text that seems original by learning from a set of examples and crafting responses based on the information provided. Despite this flexibility, there are constraints. Language models work by making predictions and creating responses using the patterns they learned. Consequently, they might produce comparable or identical responses for comparable inputs. Thus, in my opinion, this can still be argued as fraud!

To continue with the ethical aspects of AI and plagiarism, even though AI technologies can help create unique content, the line between ethical use and possible plagiarism can become unclear depending on how these tools are used. At the end of the day, we decide what our content will look like and what we will use to get there. One of the most important aspects to consider is the notion of intellectual property. If an AI system creates content using existing materials, and we are aware of this, there will be some uncertainty about the rightful ownership of the generated output Should the AI-generated text be considered truly original if it relies heavily on pre-existing works? Should we still bear the responsibility of trying to find and credit the original author(s)? In addition, the importance of intent should also be kept in mind Although AI has the ability to produce text that is not simply a direct copy, the motivation for using an AI tool is significant. If the goal is to create truly original content influenced by existing sources, then AI can be a useful tool to push creativity to new limits. However, if the goal is to cheat by slightly altering existing content to avoid detection of plagiarism, this compromises the values of academic and creative honesty. Educational institutions and publishers need to clearly define how they will handle AI-generated content. Although it will be a struggle, the rules must adapt to these technological advances.

Students and writers using AI tools need to be aware of all the good and bad things that come with using the prompts to create context. Most importantly, they should be aware of the ethical implications and best practices for maintaining honesty in their work. While AI offers promising opportunities to drive innovation, its use must be approached with caution. In closing, do not be afraid to use the technology, but use it for your own good and at your own risk!

SHARE YOUR VALUES

As mentioned before, the basis of every decision in the university is the values of those who study or work there. A part of finding these values was the 2 events that the Executive Board organised this year, but a more active spreading of values can be expressed by participating in one of the many co-determination that this university has. The word co-determination, in Dutch "medezeggenschap", refers to an organisational structure where employees, and in our case this includes students, can participate in the decisionmaking process of an organisation. At our university, as required by law, this is organised at all levels: from the University Council, which checks the Executive Board, to a Program Committees for each program, which checks its respective management decision.

IMPROVE EDUCATION, TOGETHER

The quality of our education depends on those who teach it and those who experience it. Of course, feedback is a good way to make your opinion known, but who checks that the teacher is actually listening? The power of checks and balances, as seen in a large nationwide democracy, ensures that feedback is heard, problems are followed up and our education is improved. It is therefore imperative that we students, together with staff, take part in this role of checks and balances, not only to improve the quality of education for ourselves, but also for our peers. Many of the problems you may have encountered during your studies have been taken up by the Program Committee, the Departmental Council or even the University Council, and there are many more problems that have been resolved by these bodies before you could have noticed them. You can help this process at every level of the university, starting with a small time commitment.

BECOME A BETTER YOU

In addition to the satisfaction that the previous point may give you, participation in a co-determination body is also useful for personal development. It is a serious task to take on, but for many students it has helped to teach them how to negotiate, how to present their opinions and to give them a broader perspective of what education is all about. In almost all codetermination bodies you sit together with staff members, which not only allows you to share your own perspective, but also makes you see their perspective. A rubric in which we will be reviewing "broodjes" from various spots. Today, we will start with perhaps the most logical one if you are having lunch on campus: the SPAR.

Thank you in advance for allowing us this opportunity. This will be our first "broodjes" review and we hope you will enjoy it. In the future, when you are unsure what to get from the SPAR, may this review guide you to a well-educated and tasty decision.

FRIKANDELBROODJE

PRICE: €1,95 LOTTE: ★★★★★ AREND: ★★★★

Where else to start than with a frikandelbroodje? This broodje is a staple of the Dutch lunch cuisine and perhaps the most important factor of a Dutch high school's student diet.

First impressions: Our initial reaction to this broodje was that the frikandel was too small for the size of the puff pastry. When you are taking your first bite from a frikandelbroodje, you don't want to be greeted with just puff pastry. No, instead you want to get that combination of puff pastry, curry sauce, but most importantly, the frikandel.

General impressions: When biting into the broodje, we immediately noticed that the puff pastry was somewhat stale. It started out really hard, but not in a crunchy way, and then as we continued eating it, it started to feel stale and tough. Sadly, the puff pastry was not the only issue we had with this broodje. Although the frikandel should be the main star of the show, this frikandel was really lacking in flavor. The taste of it was almost overpowered by everything else, despite the fact that nothing else had a really strong flavor. Despite all the negatives, at the end of the day this was still a frikandelbroodje. Was it the best? No, but its curry sauce was alright and it still tasted like a frikandelbroodje, albeit not a very good one.

Left-over eaters' impressions: Finishing 10 broodjes with only two people is quite difficult, so for each broodje we gave our left-overs to the people around us and asked them for their opinion. For the frikandelbroodje, they agreed with our professional opinion of it overall being an "alright", but not necessarily good frikandelbroodje. Notably, they also thought that the puff pastry was rather stale.

VEGA FRIKANDELBROODJE PRICE: €1,85

Times are changing, and with this change has come the introduction of a new concept: the vegetarian frikandelbroodje. How much like meat will it taste and will it be worthy of the title "frikandelbroodje"...?

First impressions: There were two things we immediately noticed: first, the "frikandel" actually fit in the puff pastry perfectly and second, the actual broodje is smaller than the regular variant of the frikandelbroodje. Overall, we preferred the look of the vegetarian version as the puff pastry was more intricate, but also because it felt like the frikandel and puff pastry had a better ratio.

General impressions: Let us first address the elephant in the room: this is not a frikandelbroodje. It does not taste like a frikandel and it perhaps never will. Despite this, however, we both agreed that it actually tasted really nice. The puff pastry was nice (and not stale) and the "frikandel" despite not tasting like one, had a nice texture and good flavor. The only other important thing to note is that the curry division was not great. The edges had a lot of, admittedly nice tasting, curry, but in the middle there was barely any. Overall, this item really surprised us and despite the lack of a distinct "frikandel" flavor, we do recommend it – even to those who are non-vegetarian.

Left-over eaters' impressions: They liked the flavor and experience of this broodje, but agreed that it was not really a frikandelbroodje. Instead, it reminded them more of a "saucijzenbroodje". It was also mentioned that the "frikandel" had the typical vegetarian alternative to meat flavor, but it did not affect their eating experience.

SAUCIJZENBROODJE PRICE: €1.95



Not everyone agrees with the statement that a frikandelbroodje is the best lunch you can get, instead some deviants prefer saucijzenbroodjes... But how good of a saucijzenbroodje does the SPAR have to offer?

First impressions: To be frank, nothing really. The SPAR saucijzenbroodje looks like any other.

General impressions: A saucijzenbroodje consists of the components: the saucijs and the puff pastry. Let us start with the puff pastry, this was, when compared to that of the frikandelbroodjes, more fatty and had more of a buttery taste. Out of all the napkins, the one on which this broodje was laying, had by far the most grease on it. We suspected this was due to the fact that the puff pastry clearly had more butter on or in it. The extra butter also caused the puff pastry to be more sweet than that of the others. Regarding the actual saucijs itself, it was surprisingly soft and not what one would typically suspect. Furthermore, because the puff pastry was so sweet, it would have been nice if the saucijs was a bit saltier to balance this.

Overall, this was definitely a fine saucijzenbroodje. It was nothing too special, but a nice snack regardless.

Left-over eaters' impressions: Amongst the left-over eaters there was a heavy bias, as one of them has this as their all-time favorite SPAR broodje. One left-over eater was unimpressed and noted that they were not a fan, while the other continued hyping up this specific broodje.



MEXICANOBROODJE

PRICE: €1,95 LOTTE: ★★★★★ AREND: ★★★★★

The SPAR has a clear opinion about what a mexicanobroodje should be, namely a broodje wearing a Mexican hat. Can we truly disagree with this vision? We don't know, however, what we do know from experience is that hats tend to not taste very nice.

First impressions: The first thing we noticed was the smell of this broodje, which was rather distinct and also quite strong. Additionally it was clear that lengthwise the broodje had enough filling, but this was definitely not the case in either the width or height dimensions.

General impressions: Opinions on this broodje were extremely divided. On one hand, Lotte clearly noted that she strongly hates sweet chili sauce as it is not spicy but still has a chili taste (which she does not like). Arend, however, was quite a big fan and is also an avid sweet chili sauce enjoyer. We both noted that the meat was a lot denser when compared to the broodjes that came before. It also was more flavorful when compared to the rest (whether this was a good flavor or not proved to be quite a dividing topic). Regarding the puff pastry, nothing was noted as this was just your average puff pastry.

Despite being quite a dividing item, the mexicanobroodje is nice if you are into "that kind of flavor"

Left-over eaters' impressions: The left-over eaters were rather nervous after having heard quite an extensive rant about why this broodje was absolute trash. When they started eating it, however, it turned out that they thought it was fine. No strong opinions were expressed other than that it was "nice".

UNIVERSITY SNACK

PRICE: €1.85

LOTTE:

What an intriguing item this is... What lies beyond its puff pastry? What makes it so that this, out of all items, is deserving of the name "university snack"? We were highly anticipating finally getting to try this item.

First impressions: There was a lot of puff pastry, but barely any filling – "outrageous" we exclaimed. More specifically we noted that the edges of this broodje were really thick puff pastry. We deemed this as unnecessary and had hoped to see more actual filling.

General impressions: Our complaints about the lack of filling could not have been more wrong, as it was absolutely disgusting. Seemingly the filling of the SPAR university snack is mushroom ragout, but just executed poorly. We both agreed that mushroom ragout is something we enjoyed, so that was not the issue, the issue was this specific ragout. Although the filling was an absolute disaster, the actual puff pastry was fine, but there simply was too much of it.

At the end of this broodje, our mouths were left with a poor aftertaste and a lot of dryness. If you are vegetarian, we definitely recommend the vegetarian frikandelbroodje over this. We highly recommend you do not try this broodje.

Left-over eaters' impressions: The left-over eaters agreed with our opinions and were also not a big fan. They wanted to stress our point regarding the lack of filling, as one of them could not even detect that it was mushroom ragout and only got puff pastry.



EMPANADA CARNE PRICE: €1,95 LOTTE: ★★★★★ AREND: ★★★★

After rain comes sunshine, and this saying also holds for our SPAR broodjes review. The empanada carne is a relatively new member in the SPAR family of broodjes, but it has already left a clear mark. Unlike another Mexican item, the empanada is recognizable by its distinct shape.

First impressions: Before we took a bite, we could already tell that this broodje had a really good amount of filling from its weight alone. Even though the empanada is relatively small in size, it weighed significantly more than anything else we had had before this. Additionally, we immediately noticed that the empanada carne has a really nice, hearty, smell.

General impressions: Great filling! The filling is really flavorful and has ground beef in it, due to this it feels like this broodje has more substance than others. The empanada tastes like a chili you could have made at home, and due to this it feels more like a meal and less like a snack. The dough around the filling was able to keep everything together quite well, there was no leakage. The only negative about the dough, and also about the broodje itself, is that the "closing seal" is a bit thicker than the rest of the dough. Because of this, this specific part of the broodje can get a bit dry, but it still tastes nice regardless.

Overall, we were really impressed by the empanada carne and have had it quite a few times since then. Highly recommend.

Left-over eaters' impressions: "Oehhh!" For the left-over eaters, this was their first time having the empanada carne. They were really impressed by the flavor and noted that they might start having this broodje occasionally from now onwards. They did, however, agree on the part of the "closing seal" being a bit too thick and thus dry.

FOCACCIA PAPRIKA MOZZARELLA PRICE: €2.39



Arguably, Italian cuisine is one of the finest. Nearly everyone enjoys a good pizza and if not, surely they would be open to either a portion of pasta or risotto. Amongst the rich list of Italian foods, is also the focaccia. This type of flatbread often comes with toppings, but is also enjoyable with a simple sprinkle of salt.

First impressions: The size of the actual focaccia was quite nice, it seemed to us that eating this should be enough to fill you up for a couple of hours. This broodje, however, suffered from something a lot of SPAR items suffer from: a lack of filling/toppings. Sadly, the corners and edges of this focaccia had no toppings, but in the middle there was actually quite a lot.

General impressions: The dough of this focaccia was quite decent and had a distinct enough flavor albeit not a very strong flavor. The taste was quite nice and surprisingly enough, the bread was neither dry nor hard. Regarding the toppings, they sadly did not have a lot of flavor. You could taste that you were eating paprika, but only barely. The mozzarella was undetectable aside from being able to visually see it. Overall, we only recommend this focaccia if you are in the mood for the bread itself. We do not recommend buying this broodje if you are in the mood for either paprika or mozzarella, but otherwise it is okay.

Left-over eaters' impressions: Surprisingly alright. They were also expecting the bread to be dry, despite our review, but agreed that it was not. Although the bread was not dry, they did not consider this broodje to be very remarkable.

FOCACCIA PEPPERONI

PRICE: €1,95 LOTTE: ★★★★★ AREND: ★★★★★

Maybe after reading the previous broodje introduction, you are in the mood for a pizza. Sadly, the SPAR does not offer this. The closest thing to a pizza at the SPAR would be the focaccia pepperoni.

First impressions: This focaccia is notably smaller than the focaccia paprika mozzarella, but it looked alright. Nothing too special.

General impressions: This focaccia was, like the previous one, also not dry. However, this focaccia seemed almost a bit "soggy", as if the top had not been in the oven long enough to fully cook. We really liked the topping (as we both enjoy tomato sauce with pepperoni), but the more we ate this broodje, the more the dough itself became a disappointment. Furthermore, around the edges there was no topping, and once we started eating this, it was revealed to us that the dough was in fact dry here. It seems that the only thing not making this a piece of stale bread is the tomato sauce topping with pepperoni.

Overall, if you are in the mood for pizza this is a decent enough alternative. However, if you are more in the mood for a focaccia, we definitely recommend the paprika mozzarella version.

Left-over eaters' impressions: The left-over eaters noted that this focaccia was less dry than the previous one. Additionally, it was noted by them that it reminded them of a pepperoni pizza. Their opinions were not very strong on this broodje.







APPELFLAP PRICE: €1,50 LOTTE: ★★★★★ AREND: ★★★★★

When thinking of typical lunch broodjes or snacks, most of us think of frikandelbroodjes, saucijzenbroodjes or whatever vegetarian alternative we might prefer. This is, however, not all the SPAR has to offer. The SPAR also has a selection of sweet snacks, one of them being a Dutch classic, the appelflap.

First impressions: Aside from being quite surprised that the SPAR had an appelflap, as neither of us had ever actively registered this, we thought the appelflap looked quite good. It was nice and puffy and the sugar coating also looked tasty.

General impressions: We both agreed that the SPAR has a good appelflap. The filling was nice and despite there not being too little of it, because we enjoyed it so much we would have liked more of it. The puff pastry was also nice, it was the most similar to the puff pastry of the "saucijzenbroodje" as it was quite buttery and sweet. The sugar coasting was also nice and crunchy and sweet. Our only negative remark on this snack was not on the actual snack itself, but rather its context. The university SPAR does not feel like a place where one would buy an appelflap.

Overall, we enjoyed this appelflap and if you are in the mood for one, we would highly recommend this one.

Left-over eaters' impressions: The left-over eaters also enjoyed this appelflap and remarked the puff pastry was quite flakey. The appelflap's puff pastry was in fact so flakey, that one of the left-over eaters ended up with puff pastry crumbs and flakes all over their nose.

CHOCOLADEBROODJE VANILLE PRICE: €1,55

LOTTE:

Pain au chocolat, one of France's most brilliant inventions, aside from the guillotine of course. For this edition, this will be the last broodje we review, but that certainly does not mean it will be the least. A good pain au chocolat can soothe a craving for something sweet, flakey, buttery, filled with a delicious chocolate paste. A bad one will amplify this craving.

First impressions: This chocoladebroodje seemed rather sad. The puff pastry did not appear flakey and while holding it, it also did not resemble puff pastry texture-wise. In fact, while holding it the texture seemed more like wet carton, also in the way it was bendable. This broodje also had the common issue of having very little filling, although this tends to be quite normal for chocoladebroodjes.

General impressions: The chocolate flavor, despite there being little filling, was quite good and we had no remarks on this. It was exactly as you would expect from a supermarket chocoladebroodje. The vanilla flavor was overpowered by the chocolate filling and thus we could not taste this, unless we separated it from everything else. The vanilla did, however, have quite a weird texture and as you could not taste it, this weird texture was the only thing it added to the experience. In general the texture of this broodje was weird. As we already suspected from merely holding it, the puff pastry was neither puffy nor flakey. Instead, it seemed all molded together leaving us feeling rather disappointed.

Overall, we do not recommend this chocoladebroodje and recommend the appelflap if you are craving something sweet. If you really want a chocoladebroodje, cycling to any other grocery store will be worth the trip.

Left-over eaters' impressions: The left-over eaters were also not impressed with this chocoladebroodje. Overall, they agreed with us.

SPREAD YOUR WINGS

The ATHENA logo, as you probably know, is pink with a beautiful blue owl. But what is so special about owls? And how do owls relate to the ATHENA members, or any people in general? The first question is easily answered; owls are very wise (or so they say) and of course very beautiful. But the second question requires some more elaboration.

UILSKUIKEN

In the Netherlands, six different kinds of owls can be found. The first one is the barn owl ("kerkuil" in Dutch). Its Latin name is *Tyto alba* and it is the most widely distributed owl species in the world. This owl does not live in polar or desert regions, but it can be found almost everywhere else in the world. This characteristic can also be found in people that are not easily cold; they adapt to the weather really well. It can also show a liking for travelling and sightseeing in people. Barn owls usually stick to one partner unless one of the pair is killed. This translates to loyalty and devotion in people. For visible characteristics, the barn owl is medium sized and it has a relatively light plumage, so kind of like blonde hair.

Next up we have the short-eared owl ("velduil" in Dutch). This owl goes by *Asio flammeus* in Latin. The genus *Asio* refers to the eared owls, which is where the English name comes from. The Dutch name comes from where the owl is found, namely in open country and grasslands, so fields or "velden" in Dutch. The short-eared owl moves towards the south during winter, since it is not really a fan of the cold weather in the north. You can see the same with people that prefer the warmer weather of the summer over the cold and rainy weather during the winter. This owl is also known to lure predators away from its nest by appearing to have a crippled wing. This could show in human behaviour as being good at lying or acting. Then we get the long-eared owl ("ransuil" in Dutch). In Latin, this owl is called *Asio otus*, again an eared owl. This owl is not strongly territorial or sedentary, which is unlike most owl species. It is partially migratory, so it moves to warmer areas during winter, just like the short-eared owl. Looking at the appearance of this owl, the long-eared owl is rather slim and usually has a darker plumage with a bold pattern. This can, in people, be represented by dark hair and maybe freckles or curls, but it can also show in just a more colourful choice of clothes for example.



The fourth kind is the Eurasian eagle-owl ("oehoe" in Dutch), which is called *Bubo bubo* in Latin. This is one of the largest species of owls to exist, and can therefore be represented by taller people. The Dutch name of this owl is derived from the sound it makes, which is a deep resonant *ooh-hu* with emphasis on the first syllable for the male and a more high-pitched and slightly more drawn-out *uh-hu* for the female species. This relates really well to the fact that men usually have a deeper voice than women. The Eurasian eagleowl is usually not found in busy, urban areas, which correlates to people that prefer the countryside over the city, and that like to go to the mountains, as the owl is mostly found in mountainous and rocky areas. Up next is the tawny owl ("bosuil" in Dutch). This owl is also called the brown owl and goes by *Strix aluco* in Latin. Tawny owls are highly territorial, which means that when young birds leave the nest but cannot find a vacant territory to claim, they will often starve. This might be a bit extreme when comparing this to people, but it shows in people who do not like to travel and prefer to just stay on familiar grounds and close to home. This owl makes its nest in a tree hole such that it can protect its eggs and young. You can see this represented in people by the bond someone has with their family. If someone has a very close relationship with their family, they also tend to protect and look out for them.



Lastly, we have my favourite owl, the little owl ("steenuil" in Dutch). Its Latin name is Athene noctua, and the owl is also known as the owl of Athena or owl of Minerva. This owl has its English name for a reason, since it is one of the smallest owl species that exist. The little owl, just like the tawny owl, is territorial, especially the males. They often stay in the same territory their whole life. This is, like said before, represented by people that prefer staying at home over travelling. GEWIS YA CINEMATIC UNIVERSE

There is one fraternity that also strives to remove this divide between people, namely the female students in a male-dominated study field. This fraternity also has the color blue in their logo, and a clear association to wisdom. This fraternity, which is named after the Greek goddess of knowledge, is of course ATHENA.



DAUNTLESS

Dauntless is the faction of the cool people, and they are characterized by their bravery and courage. They let all their initiates jump out of a moving train. Within GEWIS, there is one fraternity whose main theme is going out of your comfort zone, and not being scared of any challenge. They also let members do some daring action in other to proof their bravery. The only logical mapping is, thus, to Défi.



CANDOR

The members of Candor are honest, trustworthy, and very good at detecting lies. These traits do not automatically scream any particular fraternity, so we must look a little deeper to find a connection to any of them. They always dress formally, and often this entails wearing a suit. Within the Divergent society, they occupy high positions like judges and lawyers. In these positions, they enjoy talking (down) to the rest of the city. Now, with these attributes, we might be able to find a matching fraternity. Within GEWIS, there is only one group that enjoys talking (a lot) and wearing suits, and that is I.V.V.



AMITY

Amity as a faction is characterized by their peacefulness, friendship and harmony. The latter two can describe any fraternity of GEWIS, so we must look a bit further to find their GEWIS counterpart. The people that belong to this faction primarily work on the farms, outside of the main city. They live in harmony with nature, in wooden houses with a lot of windows, and sometimes even with a tree inside them. The logo of this faction is also a tree. Therefore, by these aspects, it is only fitting to map them to B.O.O.M..

ABNIGATION

Then there is only one faction left, namely Abnegation. In the series, these people are distinguished by their selflessness, and they are seen exclusively wearing gray clothes. They never look into mirrors, and do not enjoy any luxuries, including alcohol, since that is seen as selfish. A clear connection does not come immediately to any fraternity, so we, again, need to look at some deeper links. Within the Divergent universe, most adults are a part of this faction. Within GEWIS, there is one fraternity that I would suspect to be the largest, based on their characteristics. This one group is also very good at attracting the gray masses, those we never see during other GEWIS activities. This fraternity is, which you might have figured since there is only one left, GEPWNAGE.

CONCLUSION

Now that you have read all my connections between the five factions and the five fraternities of GEWIS, you might still be left with some questions or doubts. What happened to the Factionless? Does GEWIS also have Divergents, the titular characters that the whole series is based on? Who does the Board symbolize in all of this? All these questions are of course very important to fully flesh out this analogy. There is, sadly, not enough space in this article to answer all of them. Therefore, these open points are left as an exercise for the reader to answer!

B.O.O.M. COCKTAILS

N ow that we are at the start of the summer, it is time to prepare well for all the barbeque parties. Even though for most, the main focus of such a gathering will be the delicious food that comes off the grill, one must not underestimate the importance of some nice drinks on the side. By default, many of you will likely resort to a (craft) beer. Although I enjoy beer a lot, in my opinion almost nothing beats a nice and refreshing cocktail while sitting out in the sun. Therefore, I will provide you with a few simple recipes to try out at your next BBQ party!

EOUIPMENT

Even though there is a wide variety of cocktail craft equipment available, there are only a few things you actually need to start making cocktails. Now, the first thing one might think of is a cocktail shaker which is of course correct. However, in case you don't have one and don't want any initial investment, you can simply use a glass jar with a lid to shake your cocktails.

Now, actually, that is all one really needs to start making cocktails. However, some other tools on the side might make your life a lot easier. When creating cocktails, the ratio of ingredients is very important to obtain the taste you want. For that purpose, one can use a jigger or any other liquid measuring device that is precise enough. Generally, you'd want to use something that is able to measure multiples of 5 or 10 milliliters.

The last tool that I will mention here that is often used when making cocktails is a strainer. This tool is used to sift the ice cubes and possibly muddled fruit pieces from the drink when serving. There are many types of strainers, however, when just starting out, all one really needs would be a Hawthorne strainer.

BASE INGREDIENTS

With the equipment all sorted, it is now time to talk about ingredients. Most of the time, a cocktail consists of some type of booze, some type of sour ingredient, some type of sweet ingredient, a filler, and ice.

The booze part is pretty self-explanatory as it is just buying a bottle from a liquor store. However, it is important to note that one does not have to buy topshelf booze to make great cocktails. You can often find a budget booze bottle which has little noticeable difference when used in a cocktail instead of the more

The sour ingredient is most often lime or lemon juice. I absolutely recommend buying some fresh limes/ lemons and juicing them yourself.

expensive bottle.

Then there is the sweet ingredient, which is often some type of syrup. These syrups can easily be made at home with just water, sugar, and possibly another ingredient to bring some flavor. Later in this article, I will explain to you just how to make simple syrup.

The filler ingredient will vary wildly between cocktails, however, most of the time it is just some type of soda or juice. Lastly, there is ice, now, I could bore you for an hour with talk about types of ice, how to make clear ice, and the effect that using different types of ice has on your cocktails. However, when you are just in it for a simple refreshing cocktail, you won't need all that.

With that introduction out of the way, it's time to actually start making cocktails! First I will teach you how to make simple syrup, a commonly used cocktail ingredient. Afterward, I will share two of my favorite cocktails with you!

SIMPLE SYRUP

Simple syrup is as it says in the name, very simple to make. The ingredients you need are just sugar and water (you can just use tap water). There are various types of simple syrup with different ratios of sugar to water. This (2:1) simple syrup will be usable for around half a year if kept in the fridge.

INGREDIENTS

- >> Water Sugar

INSTRUCTIONS

- Weigh 2 parts of sugar and add that into a 2. saucepan (or any type of pan really).
- Weigh 1 part of water and add that to the pan 4.
- 6 Put the pan on the stove on low-medium heat.
- Heat up the mixture while stirring. Make sure 8 that it does not boil! Otherwise the sugar will caramelize which is not the effect that we want
- 10. Once all sugar is dissolved, turn off the heat and let the syrup cool down to room temperature.
- 12. Add the simple syrup to an empty glass bottle. Make sure to rinse the bottle with boiling water before putting in the simple syrup.

COCKTAIL 1: BRAMBLE

The bramble is a nice and refreshing gin cocktail with a taste of lemon and brambles. The cocktail is traditionally made using a London Dry gin, (note: London dry is a style of gin, not a brand. It will mention this on the bottle.), a bramble liqueur called Crème de Mûre, lemon juice, and simple syrup. Crème de Mûre is not widely available in liquor stores, one can also use Crème de Cassis to make the bramble. It will taste a little different but still delicious.

INGREDIENTS

- >> 45 mL London Dry Gin
- » 30 mL Lemon juice
- 12.5 mL Crème de Mûre / Crème de Cassis **>>**
- **》** 12.5 mL (2:1) Simple syrup
- >> 1 Slice of lemon
- >> 2 Brambles (berries)

INSTRUCTIONS

- Carefully measure all ingredients and combine 1. them in your shaker.
- 3. Fill the rest of the shaker with an adequate amount of cubed ice. The amount of ice depends on step 4 and possibly on the size of your glass.
- 5. Shake until your hands are ice cold and condensation has built up on the outside of the shaker.
- 7. Simply dump the contents of the shaker into the glass. Alternatively, you can fill a glass with crushed ice (you can create this by putting ice in a tea towel and smashing it with a pan until the ice shards are very small) and strain the contents of the shaker over the crushed ice.
- Garnish with a slice of lemon and 2 brambles 9. and add a straw.

COCKTAIL 2: MARGARITA

The margarita is a classic cocktail with many different variations known to it. The naming of these variations tends to differ a bit and be confusing. Therefore I will not specify the name of the specific variation we're making here. The margarita variant we are making is made with a tequila reposado made of 100% blue agave (it should mention reposado and 100% blue agave on the bottle), however, you can make it with any tequila of your choice. Furthermore, we will use the orange liqueur Cointreau, some lime juice, and some agave syrup. The agave syrup can simply be bought from the supermarket (it's often next to the honey).

INGREDIENTS

- 35 mL Tequila reposado **>>**
- **>>** 15 mL Cointreau
- **»** 20 mL Lemon juice
- 20 mL Agave syrup **>>**
- **>>** 1 Lime wedge

INSTRUCTIONS

- Follow steps 1-4 from the previous recipe.
- 3. Garnish with a wedge of lime.



SOFTWARE PROJECT AURORA TO BRING COLORS IN THE GEWIS ROOM TO LIFE

n 1880, Thomas Edison received the historic patent on the incandescent lightbulb. With this invention, mankind was able to "efficiently" produce artificial light, mostly to no longer be in the dark after sunset. We as Eindhovenaren know all about it: without Philips starting the production of lightbulbs in 1891, Eindhoven probably wouldn't have become the 5th biggest city of The Netherlands. Now, a lamp's purpose is no longer to simply light up a room, but for example creating a better workspace or setting a certain mood in a room. At the TU/e, we even have the Intelligent Lighting Institute to do research on these topics.

But what does all this have to do with GEWIS? Well, in 't Dakterras we have two types of lighting systems, namely the default Metaforum office lights, but also our own "party lights". The latter set of light sources is used every borrel and also at other activities that benefit from a different ambiance than a Metaforum office. AViCo and the BAC achieved this by just setting these lights to a static color. However, many years ago with the old "party-lights," I found out that you could also apply some animations or effects to the lights, even though this was fairly limited. This (as you can imagine) sparked some interest.

In 2022, these old lights were replaced by new ones. The old spots were already 10 years old and LED technology has improved quite significantly over the years. While the old fixtures had 36 small red LEDs, 36 small green LEDs and 36 small blue LEDs for a total of 108 LEDs, the new ones have seven big LEDs that can all produce red, green, blue, cold white, warm white, amber (yellow/orange) and UV light. This brings many opportunities to choose just the right color for specific activities. The new system also includes two so-called moving heads, which are able to project a beam of light in three dimensional space!

THE WHY

The new system could already do more colors and effects than the old one, but it was still "dumb". On the controller, you choose a mode and a speed. That's it, and that is also all it can do. This is of course fine for simple activities like a borrel, but even then you might want to do fancy stuff like having the BAC logo (which is now projected on the wall each borrel) turn figureeights on the floor to hide an empty GEWIS room at the start of the borrel. The idea to truly leverage the power of the new lights system already existed when the plans for the new lighting system were made. Implementation actually started not soon after with the birth of the "AViCo Centurion Marathon".

This activity was an idea of Samuel, Gijs and I, where lighting could play a primary role in the room. By flashing lights during each horn, the lamps would actually support the music that is playing, which in turn made the activity itself much more special and unique. However, this would require us to synchronize the audio with the lights (and the TV screens for a supportive role). The first proof-of-concept worked well enough, but was not a sustainable solution, as it was not trivial to get the software to start. Furthermore, the program was completely tailored to these types of mixes, so it would not be possible to use it for any other purpose. Secondly, there also was the desire within the ABC to renew the Infoscreen (the TV in the boardroom) and the posterscript (the TVs in the room showing posters) into a single narrowcasting system, as both have their limitations. The Infoscreen for example does a fullpage refresh once in a while to refresh the information being displayed, as its database is an on-disk JSON file. The posterscript works as a black box using Trello, which makes it difficult to fix things in case posters get broken (which happens more often than you think).

All these things inspired me to build a software system that could control the GEWIS party lights and the screens and synchronize these with music, which allows lots of effects that play on the beat. But it comes with several caveats, because the system should be versatile enough to support all creative ideas.

THE (TECHNICAL) HOW

For the second edition of the Centurion Marathon, the first version of Aurora (the new narrowcasting and lighting system) was ready. Based on a publishsubscribe architecture using websockets, devices like screens, light controllers and audio players can connect to Aurora and listen for incoming commands. Aurora then sends messages to each device telling them what to do, which keeps the logic centralized in the core application and keeps the logic in the listening devices simple.

Most of the work lies in abstractions to make all complex details transparent, like how each light works or how you change the color of each light. Maintainability is maybe one of the most important

non-functional requirements in this project, because otherwise Aurora will become difficult to keep running in a few years (and me being graduated). It would be sad to see a project being retired because no one understands anymore.

Controlling the lights is the largest and most complex part of the software. To send instructions to different fixtures, DMX512 (also called just DMX) is the industry standard to achieve this. For those who this name does not ring a bell: DMX512 is a serial communication bus of 512 channels, where each channel has a value between 0 and 255. Fixtures, like the spots and moving heads, then listen to a defined range of channels.

Because every fixture has its own

implementation of the DMX protocol, not all channels have the same effect. This makes it very difficult to harmoniously control the lights, so Aurora abstracts from all these details and only keeps simple interfaces and methods (like functions to set colors) to the developer. Moreover, the actual channel values need to be sent to the bus so the fixtures can change their colors. Aurora does this at a frequency of 35Hz and implements this by a simple event loop. Every component that handles the changing of the lights has its tick method called around 35 times per second. To synchronize with the beat of the music, every component can also implement a beat method, which is called on every beat of the music. With these two event loops, it becomes really easy to create all kinds of effects.



THE WHAT

But what can we now do? The Centurion Marathon is a prime example of the possibilities, but it is now fairly simple to add new effects for the lights or new modes to the system in general (Spoelbakkenrace anyone?). With a simple click, you can change what a screen in the room is showing to everyone. And with a few clicks, you can switch from a boring office to a vibrant afterparty at GEWIS. We have already seen something like this, as Aurora was the software that controlled the lights and visuals at the Feestcafé "De BAC"-borrel.

In my opinion, most of the magic lies in the effects that we can now create. Things like waves (a light going around the room) and sparkles (a random light turns on and off again at high speed) are now very easy to make and bring a completely new vibe to the room. But most importantly, this has all become very accessible for GEWIS members. With the old controller the barrier of entry was much higher, because you needed to know how the controller works. Aurora takes away all these problems and makes fun light configurations much easier!

Even though Aurora is not fully in production at the time of writing, I already feel we are now able to fully utilize the power of the new lighting system. With new effects and automated control, it has become easier than ever to transform 't Dakterras into any mood that one desires. The Intelligent Lighting Institute can be proud.

COOKING WITH ATHENA: BLUEBERRY ROLLS

t is not a secret that ATHENA likes things sweet. For every meeting we let someone bake a dessert (sometimes involuntary). During our lustrum week we had a hangover breakfast with just sweet food. We have even had an internal dinner with just desserts. This was delicious, but after 11 desserts you get really nauseous apparently. Therefore, we want to share with you one of our favourite recipes, that is also very easy to make: blueberry rolls.

STEP 1

Preheat the oven at 200 °C. Clean the lemon, then grate its skin and squeeze out half of it.

STEP 2

Roll out the croissant dough. Spread the blueberry confiture over the dough and sprinkle the lemon grate on top. Cut across the vertical lines in 3 equal slices (do not cut the diagonal lines!). Spread the blueberries over it.

Roll the slices over the long side and cut each in 8 pieces. You should now have 24 small rolls. Spread these in the baking tin. They can touch a bit, but do not put them too close together. Bake the rolls for around 20 minutes in the oven, until they are golden-brown.

Mix the powdered sugar with 1 tablespoon of lemon juice and spread this over the rolls.


YO SIBLING A TALE OF DETERMINATION AND GROWTH



HOW TO SELL DRUGS (SEMI-LEGALLY)

n my life I've had a number of different jobs. The most boring ones were probably working at a supermarket, ice cream parlor, and/or Blokker. Then there is the time I had to take care of 200 chickens for a German lady who did DJ-ing gigs in India. Although that last one might sound unbelievable, it is in my opinion not the craziest job I've had. As the title might suggest, and absolutely in line with this edition's theme, in this article I will tell you a little bit about how to sell drugs (semi-legally). That is, selling weed in a coffeeshop. The aim of this article is not to convince you or encourage anyone to interact with weed or drugs in general, it is simply meant to serve as an informative piece about working in a coffeeshop.

Let me start by telling you a little bit about the particular coffeeshop I work at. This coffeeshop started as and has pretty much remained a family business, founded by a Turkish couple about 30 years ago. A large part of their immediate family is involved in a plethora of tasks, all necessary in order for the shop to function efficiently. Despite not being related to them at all, it sometimes feels like I'm somewhat part of the family. I've been given food many times, I've been offered (premium) weed samples, and on a handful of occasions I've even been ordered to take a break from helping customers to practice the new crochet stitch the older Turkish lady taught me. We've had multiple cats too, which really adds to the family vibe.

But what does one actually do at a coffeeshop? Well, the answer is actually not as exciting as some may think. Aside from helping customers, my main responsibilities are quite similar to a supermarket job. A fair share of my time goes to inventory management, which includes tasks such as refilling the weed drawers, making sure the inventory is correctly updated in the system, and letting my boss know ahead of time that I'm running low on a certain product. This last part is especially important. At the time of writing this article, any coffeeshop in the Netherlands is only allowed to have a total of 500 grams of weed on the premises at a single point in time. The police, in combination with city hall, regularly check whether a coffeeshop upholds this rule, and a violation is punished severely. Not too long ago, a coffeeshop in Eindhoven was closed down by the police for over a year because they found 380 kilos of softdrugs. While this is of course an insane amount, I can't blame coffeeshops for having more than 500 grams of weed in stock. In my experience, this number is actually vastly inadequate in comparison to the rate at which we sell said weed. Roughly estimated, during a single shift I sometimes sell as much as 3 to 6 times that amount! It requires near constant communication with my boss to ensure we have enough stock, which can get pretty hectic if the stock of a certain product is getting low while there is already a wave of customers waiting. Luckily, most of these customers are actually quite patient and understanding. Sometimes more so than your standard supermarket or retail store customer.

In certain areas of society, there is a lot of prejudice when it comes to weed and the people that smoke it. Even a large part of our own government seems to hold quite a negative view of this group of people. Not too long ago, the government sanctioned an experiment to examine the viability of growing and selling weed completely legally. For those who are not well-versed in the world of weed, simply put, weed is not legal, it is merely accepted (or "gedoogd" in Dutch). Producing weed for retail is considered illegal (at the time of writing, any household is allowed a maximum of 5 weed plants, which after 4 to 8 months, if you're lucky and a very talented gardener, comes out to be 100-300 grams of weed per plant). But now, the government wants to experiment with actually legally grown and sold weed. However, the actual owners of participating and non-participating coffeeshops as well as users of the product were largely excluded from any discussions about how this experiment would be conducted. Despite multiple attempts and a number of very well-written and polite letters, they were still denied a voice. While there is much more to be said about this topic, I won't dive into further detail here, as this is merely meant to serve as an example of how the misconceptions and prejudice of the general public about the world of weed and its inhabitants can lead to discrimination, influencing rules and regulations (such as the totally unviable 500 gram rule), which in turn influences my work

While I do get the occasional bad apple (shoutout to the customer who saw me count the money he had given me a second time and rudely asked "can you do basic math?!"), I mostly meet a lot of friendly and polite people at work. A lot of our customers are just ordinary people like you and me. People that just want to have a fun evening with some good friends. Students that need to relax after a particularly soul crushing exam period. Curious tourists. Fancy businessmen celebrating a profitable deal. Hard working immigrants that do their best to order in Dutch. People from neighboring countries that hit up a number of coffeeshops before heading back home with their bounty. And so much more. While a lot of customers share (small) details about their lives, the most memorable customers are the ones with a Story.

In some cases Story refers to a story they told me, but some customers also become the Story themselves. A veteran who shared a story of his deployment, how someone in his squad snapped, grabbed a grenade, and threw it into their midst. Red Light District workers who tip me generously, without fail. A regular looking man who came in at 10 in the morning, broke down crying within minutes, threatened to set me on fire, and vowed he'd burn my house down (he doesn't know where I live, I never saw him again). A talkative, "gezellig", and unsuspicious looking woman who I had made small talk with on a number of occasions, only to later find out she stabbed her previous husband multiple times. While I'd like to reiterate that the people with a Story are the minority, I think it is safe to say we get a very wide range of customers, as these are just some highlight stories.

The colleagues, the fast-paced work, the legal issues, and the customers combined ensure that this job rarely gets boring. Sure, it might not be mathematics or computer science related, but it has definitely been a job that taught me valuable skills such as basic math, working efficiently and independently, compassion and patience, and that has reminded me of my privilege. Needless to say, I think working here has been quite the experience.




